
Autumn Half Term Holiday Poppy Art Project


Thank you to everyone who completed the British Legion and St Luke's Church Poppy Art Project for homework over half term.

Here are some photos of all you poppies together. Can you spot yours?

























Remembrance Day

poem by Licentenant Colonel John McCrae, 3 May 1915

We are the Dead, Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
In Flanders fields.

If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flancers fields.
